

#### **Objectives of the Trust**

#### 1. To raise funds and public awareness for:

- The work of the hospices in Kenya, which currently include the hospices at Nairobi, Nyeri, Eldoret, Kisumu, Mombasa, Meru, Nakuru, Nyahururu and the Palliative Care Unit at Kijabe Hospital;
- The benefit of the residents in Kenya, directed towards the treatment care and counselling of persons who are terminally ill with cancer or other incurable diseases;
- The counselling of their families and close associates;
- The education and the training of those providing or involved with such treatment, care and counselling.

# 2. To act as the agency for grant-making organisations which operate through UK charities in their support of overseas projects.

#### **Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees**

When there is the requirement to appoint a trustee personal contacts are used to find suitable candidates. The appointment of a trustee has to have the unanimous agreement of the existing trustees. New trustees are briefed on the objectives of the Trust and the deed governing its activities

#### **Policy on Reserves**

The trust maintains reserves to meet at least the estimated administration costs for one year. In addition funds may be held to meet commitments made but not disbursed. A commitment to fund a project is only made when the cash is available.

#### Commentary on the year and future plans

It has been a difficult year for fund raising but, as can be seen in the list of projects funded, we have been able to continue support for our friends in Kenya. The number of hospices we assist has grown in the year with the setting up of Nakuru hospice. We have news of others being proposed so the demands for support from us inevitably will grow. The cost of drugs in Kenya remains high and we have sent £10,100 in the year towards these.

In the immediate future much of our support will be for the training of nurses in palliative care on a 18-month course run by Nairobi Hospice in conjunction with Oxford Brookes University, UK. We feel that in this way we maximise the beneficial effect of our funding to Kenya by training nurses and other medical staff, who, in turn, will pass on their knowledge of palliative care to other health care workers.
