

#### **Objectives of the Trust**

#### 1. To raise funds and public awareness for:

- The work of the hospices in Kenya, which currently include the hospices at Nairobi, Nyeri, Eldoret, Kisumu (including Siaya), Mombasa (Coast), Meru, Nakuru, Nyahururu, the Palliative Care Units at Kijabe and Chogoria hospitals, and KEHPCA, the Kenya Hospice and Palliative Care Association;
- The benefit of the residents in Kenya, directed towards the treatment care and counselling of persons who are terminally ill with cancer or other incurable diseases;
- The counselling of their families and close associates;
- The education and the training of those providing or involved with such treatment, care and counselling.

# 2. To act as an agency for UK grant-making bodies working through charities to support projects overseas.

#### **Recruitment and Appointment of Trustees**

When there is the requirement to appoint a trustee personal contacts are used to find suitable candidates. The appointment of a trustee has to have the unanimous agreement of the existing trustees. New trustees are briefed on the objectives of the Trust and the deed governing its activities

#### **Policy on Reserves**

The trust maintains reserves to meet at least the estimated administration costs for one year. In addition funds may be held to meet commitments made but not disbursed. A commitment to fund a project is only made when the cash is available.

#### Commentary on the year and future plans

It has been a second difficult year for fundraising but, as can be seen in the list of projects funded, we have in fact slightly increased support for our friends in Kenya. We began the year with a special reception at St Thomas' Hospital, London, that was attended by many supporters and three of our patrons. The number of hospices we assist has again grown, with support for the new Siaya Hospice near Kisumu and the commitment of a grant towards a vehicle for the PC Unit at Chogoria Hospital. Demands for our support continue to grow. The cost of drugs in Kenya remains high and another £4,950 was sent towards the costs of these. Grants totalling £14,700 were made towards fees for nine nurses or other hospice staff to take an 18-month course in palliative care at Nairobi Hospice which recommenced in July 2009 under new franchise arrangements with Oxford Brookes University.

Our future work will continue to support, in particular, the increasing development of new hospices and education and training for palliative care. We feel that in this way we maximise the beneficial effect of our funding to Kenya by training nurses and other medical staff, who, in turn, will pass on their knowledge of palliative care to other health care workers.
